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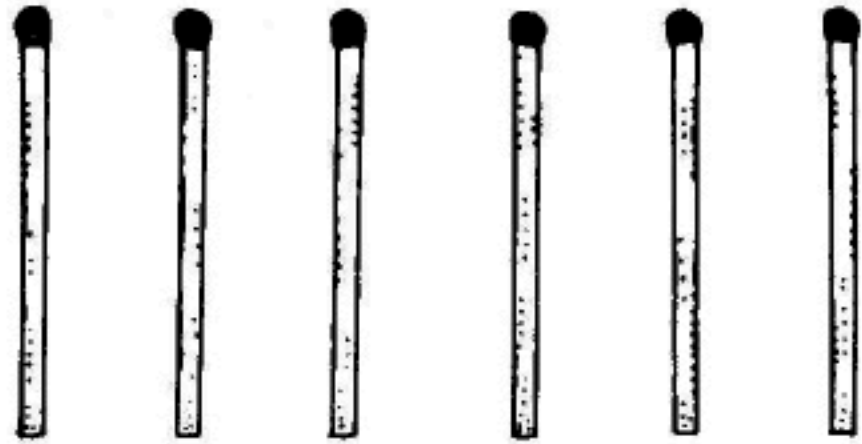

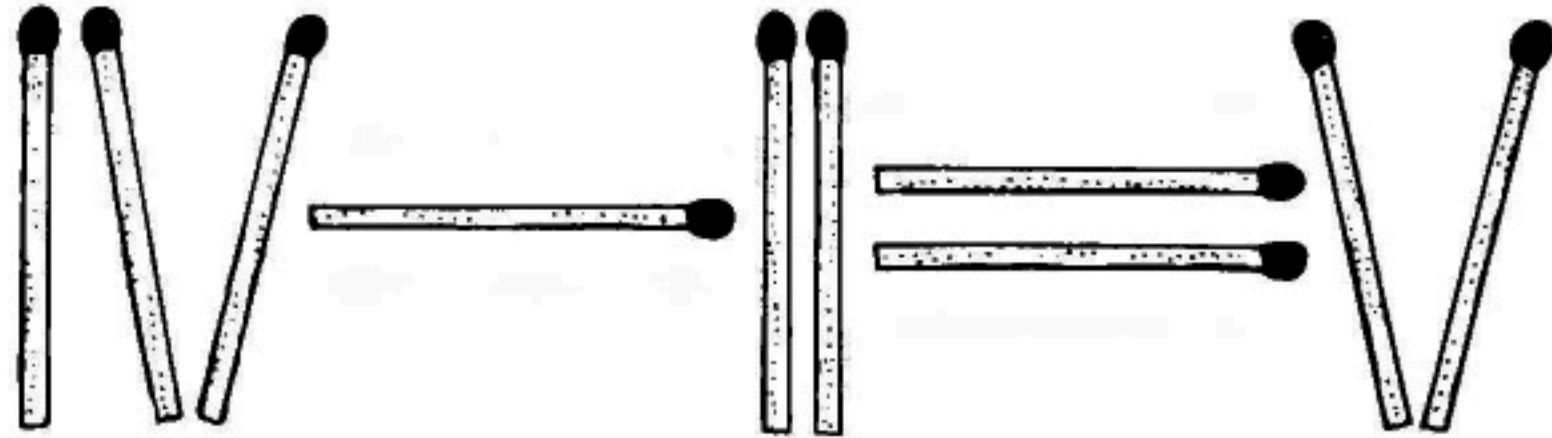
Here are some matheMATCHical puzzles using matchsticks:

1. Set out six matches like this:

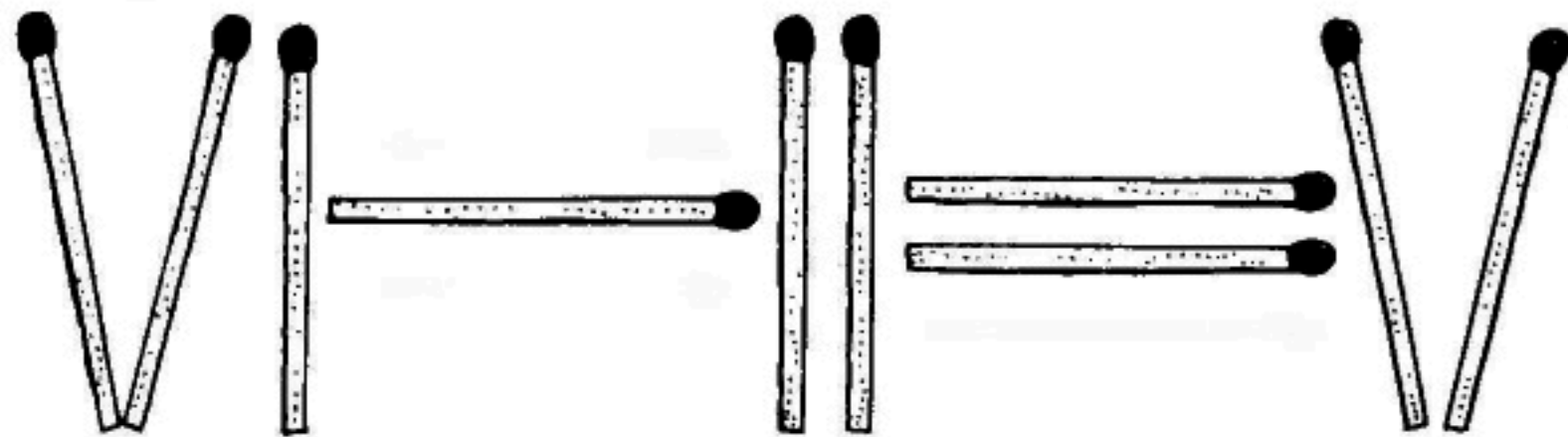


Now add 5 more to make 9.

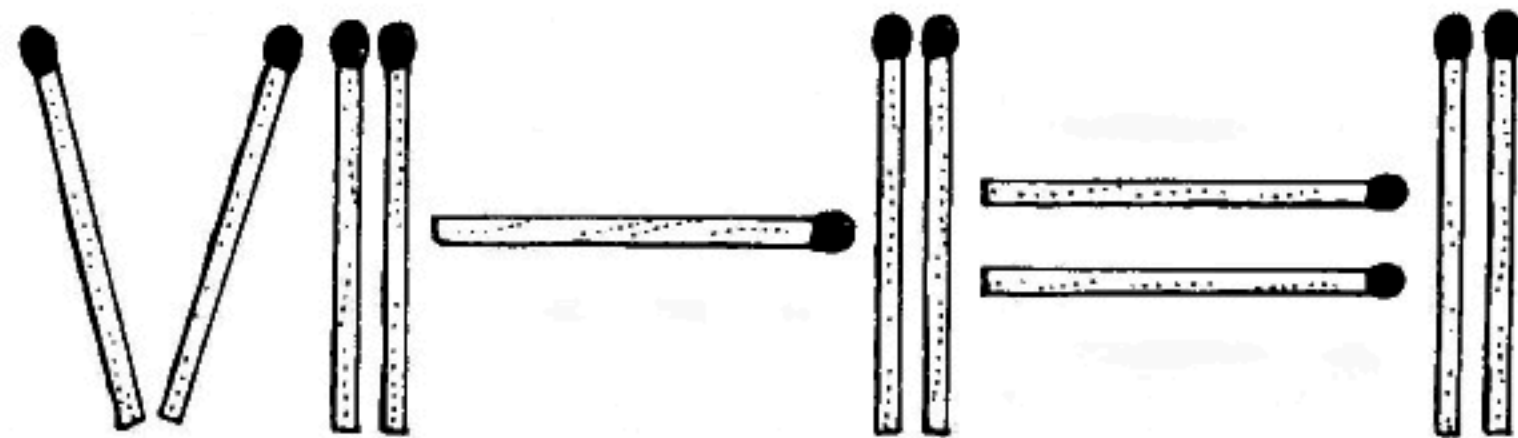
2. Move just 1 match to make this Roman sum work:



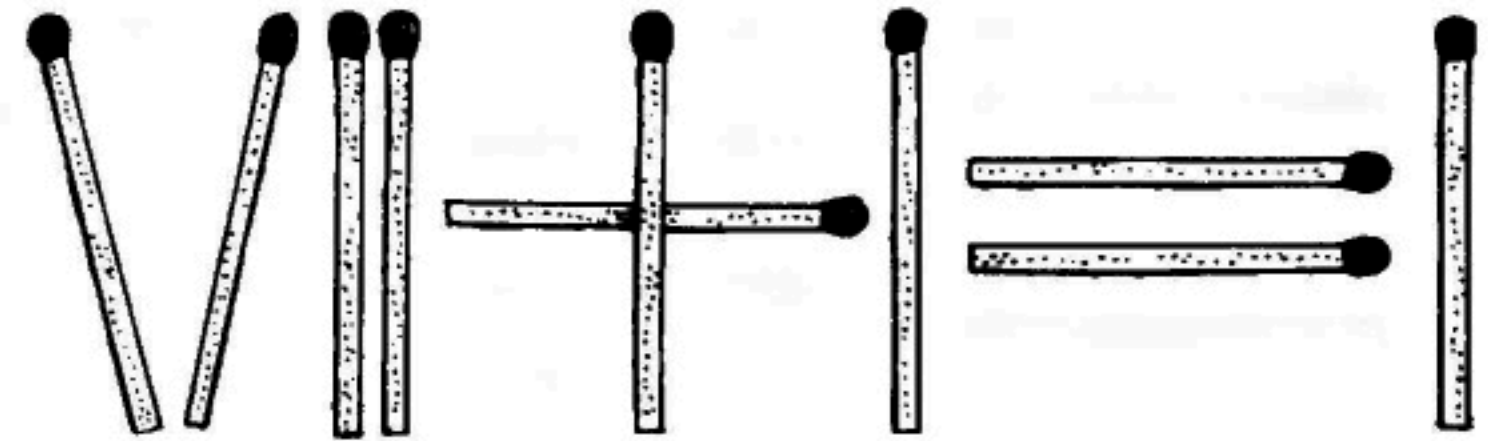
3. Make this sum correct by moving just 1 match:



4. Move 2 matches to make this sum correct:



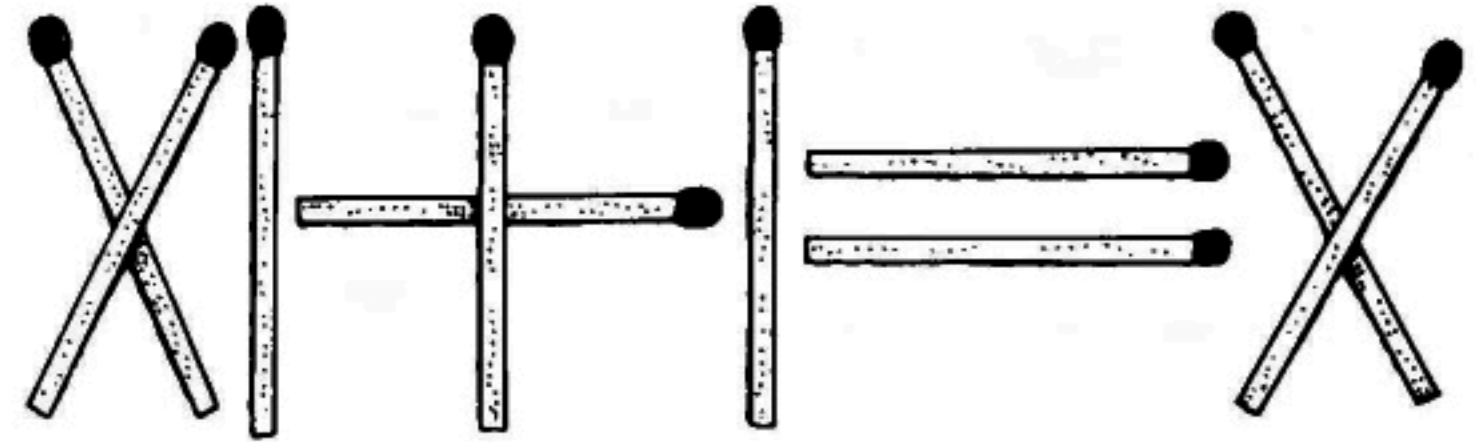
5. Remove 3 matches to make this sum correct:



6. This sum will be right if you move just 1 match:

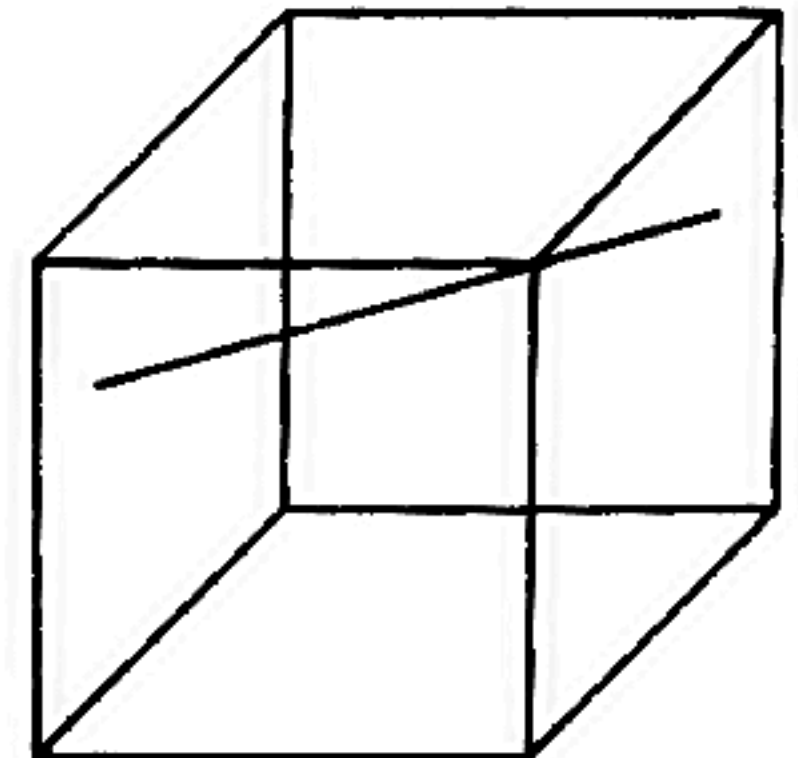


7. Make this sum correct without moving any matches:
